Drawing Closer to God

The focus of spiritual prayer practices deepens our relationship with the living Christ. "Drawing Closer to God," Saturday, November 14, between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., will introduce participants to two of four different spiritual prayer practices: Praying in Color, Contemplative Photography, Praying with Beads, and Labyrinth: Walking Prayer.

The Keynote Speaker is Bishop Linda Lee, Bishop-in-Residence at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary and the first African-American woman to be elected bishop in the North Central Jurisdiction. Bishop Lee is working in the areas of spirituality, spiritual formation, and United Methodist studies and polity. She is editor of the book "A New Dawn in Beloved Community: Stories with the Power to Transform Us," which was the focus of study here at St. Andrew last winter in a class led by Deacon Regina.

<u>Mentoring of Children –</u> Churchill School in Homewood

Our Bishop has been emphasizing the need for us to be involved in mentoring children and youth. And St. Andrew is fortunate that Churchill School in Homewood has a program set up which uses volunteers to help children for one hour after school. The children can come to Homework Club one or more days (Monday through Thursday) from 3 to 4 pm after school. The program has varied slightly from year to year (I think this is the 4th year now). But each adult volunteer gets to develop a relationship with a couple of children over the course of the year. Last year there was a shortage of volunteers, so I'm sure more from our church would be welcomed. The program usually starts sometime in October. Those of us who've done it before will probably be contacted soon as to when the orientation meeting will be. If you are interested in volunteering one day a week for one hour, contact Anna or Lucy to find out how to get signed up for the orientation meeting. Whenever there's no school there is no Homework Club, so you do get some breaks. And most of us do have a conflict occasionally, which can be worked out.



Spaghetti Dinner Fund-Raiser Report

Congratulations to all! WE DID IT! This was our first Spaghetti Dinner, and we had a few little glitches, but, thanks to the wonderful team-work of all of our volunteers, dessert donors, and our chief spaghetti-sauce cook, Anita, we had an extremely successful event.

Our gross proceeds from ticket sales, sales of left-over desserts and spaghetti (\$2053.55), and from some generous donations (totaling \$540.57) were 2,594.12. Our expenses totaled \$400.57. So our profit from this event was \$2,193.55. Thanks to all who helped to make this event such a success.

Third Sunday Loose Change Collection in November

The recipient of our third-Sunday Loose Change Collection in November will be the Honduras Mission Project. This is the Mission that Lucy participates in where a group from Northern Illinois works alongside the Hondurans to build six small concrete-block houses (this year they will actually be doing 7). In addition to the funds contributed by the participants in the trip, it is necessary to raise a lot of additional funds to accomplish all this. They work in the southern (poorest) part of Honduras in a remote rural village.

Thanksgiving Collection of "Special Needs Items" for Respond Now

St. Andrew's Missions and Social Concerns Committee has suggested a collection of Special Needs items for Respond Now as our special "Thanksgiving" effort. In gratitude for what we have, we can share so that people with few resources can have some of the basic hygiene items that we take for granted. These items cannot be purchased with a Snap card (what we used to call "Food Stamps"). And yet they are very necessary items. On the first three Sundays of November we'll have boxes in the narthex to collect these items. Suggestions are as follows:

Bar soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste and tooth brushes, dish detergent, laundry detergent, toilet tissue, hand lotion, disposable razors, shaving cream, women's sanitary napkins or tampons, disposable diapers (especially sizes 4 & 5, which Respond Now doesn't receive enough of), and baby wipes.



Cookie Walk/Bazaar Fundraiser Scheduled for Saturday, December 12

For the past two years since we started doing it, St. Andrew's Cookie Walk has been a successful event. It is scheduled this year for Saturday, December 12, but we still need a chair or co-chairs for the event. Who will step up to the plate to get going on this important fund-raiser?



PADS Shelter Ministry

St. Andrew's PADS ministry to homeless women and children is up and running in our Fellowship Hall on Wednesday nights. However, we're still short some volunteers. We need a regular, 4th-week volunteer for the breakfast shift, 5 to 5:15 a.m. until 7 to 7:15 a.m. This involves preparing and serving breakfast, and clean-up. We also need a man to come in at about 5:30 a.m. on the second week, whose primary responsibility would be to wet-mop the floors—the hall, bathrooms, and kitchen. In addition, we are desperately in need of a back-up person for the 3 a.m. shift, as we need to ensure that we have at least two volunteers present on all shifts. You should only need to work one shift a month (except when we have a 5th Wednesday and we have to ask some volunteers if they would be willing to do an extra one).

Christmas Collection of Food and Toys for Respond Now

As in the past few years, we will collect new toys and games and \$10 gift cards for Respond Now's Christmas food and gifts distribution. Toys requiring batteries are not a good choice as replacement batteries tend to be too expensive. Toys and games are needed for all ages. For teens we are giving gift cards of \$10 from local stores such as Target and Walmart. Please do not wrap.

Now is the time to shop for toys and games that you find on sale while you are shopping. Gifts will be placed under a tree in the narthex after Thanksgiving, but gift cards should be given to a member of the Missions and Social Concerns Committee or placed in the Sunday offering plate.

For the food part, this year our congregation has been asked to collect **800 boxes of jello** (not necessarily Jello brand; Aldi's has their generic variety for \$.35 per box, and some of the other stores have a generic available at a very reasonable price, also. Since we have advance notice of what we have been asked to collect, we can watch the ads in the grocery stores and Walgreens, etc. and may even find the Jello brand on sale. 800 boxes is a lot, but if we start now, WE CAN DO IT!



Chair Yoga Classes

Yoga is a great way to reduce stress, increase endurance, and feel better overall. Even better, participating in yoga can help you burn calories, increase core strength, and improve posture and balance.

A gentle form of yoga in which students do not get onto the floor is now being offered in Fellowship Hall on Monday and Wednesday afternoons at 2:30. The class is taught by Jeffrey Lippert, certified instructor. It is free for SilverSneakers members and available at a nominal fee to others. So come, join the fun!
